Today's **Black Student Union** spotlight:


The Black Panther Party was an African American revolutionary organization that was formed in 1966 and reached its heyday a few years later. Its initial purpose was to patrol Black neighborhoods to protect residents from police brutality. The Black Panthers' campaign for African American equality had a lasting impact on Black empowerment, and its influence continues to be felt in such current social movements as Black Lives Matter.

Beaumont Student Heart Check at Dearborn High on Sat, Feb. 4 From 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., students ages 13 to 18, particularly student athletes, can come in by appointment for a free diagnostic test, including an ECG to look for possible heart problems. The tests can detect heart problems that might not be found in a regular sports physical.

You may see this event at Dearborn High in the news, as the clinic expects to host the 20,000th student who has received a free heart exam from Beaumont.
